Section Description

1 Requirements for instructors [§120A.22, subd. 10]

Eliminates, under the compulsory instruction section, the option of completing a "teacher competency examination" to fulfil the minimum requirements to provide instruction to a child. No such relevant examination currently exists in Minnesota.

2 Additional duties [§124D.141, subd. 2]

Eliminates outdated or now unnecessary language.

3 Early childhood program eligibility [§124D.165, subd. 4] Eliminates obsolete language.

4 Revenue reserved [§124D.862, subd. 7]

Updates an incorrect reference in achievement and integration aid section.

- 5 Services to people with visual and physical disabilities [§134.31, subd. 4a] Updates references to conform with federal terminology changes.
- 6 **Limitations of order effective January 1, 2015, and later [§609A.03, subd. 7a]** Removes MDE from the list of agencies that receive notifications of criminal expungements, which is obsolete after the creation of PELSB.

7 Revisor instruction.

Reorganizes subsections of Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.30, pertaining to statewide testing and reporting, into new subdivisions and sections. The changes in
