## **1** Digital picture and recording misrepresentation.

Creates a gross misdemeanor offense for someone who intentionally alters a digital picture or recording of another person, or owned by another person, (1) without the subject's consent, (2) in a manner that makes it appear that the subject gave consent, and (3) with a malicious intent.
