Subject Disclosure by Pharmacists

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Overview

This bill modifies pharmacy disclosure requirements, and prohibits pharmacy contracts from preventing pharmacists from disclosing certain payment information to patients.

Summary

Section Description

1 Payment disclosure.

Amends § 151.214.

Subd. 1. Explanation of pharmacy benefits. Requires a pharmacist to provide to patients the net amount the pharmacy will receive from all sources for dispensing a prescription drug, in addition to the pharmacy's usual and customary price. (Under current law, a pharmacy can provide the usual and customary price or the net amount the pharmacy will be paid from the employer plan, health plan company, or pharmacy benefit manager.)

Subd. 2. No prohibition on disclosure. Provides that contracts between an employer plan, health plan company, or pharmacy benefit manager cannot prohibit a pharmacist from informing a patient when the amount the patient is required to pay for a drug under the patient's health plan is greater than the amount the patient would pay if purchased out-of-pocket at the pharmacy's usual and customary price.

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
