Overview

The bill places limits on the copayment that a health plan can require an enrollee to pay at the point of sale.

Summary

Section	Description
1	Limits on prescription drug copayments. Adds § 62Q.495.
	Prohibits a health plan that provides prescription drug coverage from requiring an enrollee to pay a copayment at the point of sale that is greater than the lesser of:
	(1) the allowable claim amount the pharmacy will receive from the health plan company or pharmacy benefit manager; or
	(2) the amount an individual would pay for the drug at the pharmacy without using health coverage or any other source of drug coverage benefits or applicable discounts.
	States that the section is effective August 1, 2019, and applies to health plans issued or renewed on or after that date.
