

**Subject** Requirements for supervisors of temporary body art technicians

## Overview

This bill moves the requirements for supervisors of temporary body art technicians from a section governing licensure of body art establishments to a section governing licensure of body art technicians. It also modifies the supervision requirements for body piercing technicians and the circumstances under which a supervising body piercing technician must submit a supervisory plan to the commissioner.

## Summary

Section	Description
1	<p><b>Supervisors.</b></p> <p>Adds subd. 7a to § 146B.03. Authorizes a body piercing technician who has been licensed for at least one year in Minnesota or a jurisdiction with reciprocity or who has performed at least 500 body piercings to supervise a temporary body piercing technician. (Under current law, a body piercing technician must be licensed for at least two years in order to supervise a temporary technician.) Also allows a body piercing technician to supervise up to four temporary technicians, rather than two temporary technicians as in current law, without providing a supervisory plan to the commissioner. The supervision requirements for tattoo technicians are current law and are being moved from section 146B.02, subdivision 7a, which is being repealed.</p>
2	<p><b>Repealer.</b></p> <p>Repeals section 146B.02, subdivision 7a (requirements for supervisors of temporary body art technicians).</p>
