Overview

Codifies in statute the getting to work grant program, which was created in session law in 2017 and makes grants to nonprofit organizations to provide, repair, or maintain motor vehicles that will assist low-income individuals in obtaining or keeping employment. Outlines program and application criteria, including specifying that all grants are for two years and lowering the eligible age for participants from 22 to 18. Requires a biannual report to the legislature on program outcomes and makes a blank appropriation to the program.

The getting to work grant program was appropriated \$100,000 in each year of the 2017 Jobs Omnibus law as a onetime appropriation.
