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Overview

This bill requires health plans to include coverage for ectodermal dysplasias, including reconstructive breast surgery, prosthetic hair, and dental work.

1	<p>Required coverage.</p> <p>Requires health plans to provide coverage of reconstructive breast surgery when breast tissue is absent due to ectodermal dysplasia.</p> <p>Effective date. This section is effective January 1, 2020, and applies to health plans issued on or after that date.</p>
2	<p>Required coverage.</p> <p>Requires health plans to provide coverage for prosthetic hair when hair loss is due to ectodermal dysplasias.</p> <p>Effective date. This section is effective January 1, 2020, and applies to health plans issued on or after that date.</p>
3	<p>[62A.3096] Coverage for Ectodermal Dysplasias.</p> <p>Subd. 1. Definitions. Defines ectodermal dysplasias.</p> <p>Subd. 2. Coverage. Requires health plans to provide coverage for ectodermal dysplasias.</p> <p>Subd. 3. Dental coverage. (a) Requires health plans to provide coverage for dental treatments, including bone grafts, dental implants, orthodontia, dental prosthodontics, and dental maintenance, when related to ectodermal dysplasias.</p> <p>(b) States that if the dental treatment is covered by a dental insurance plan or other health plan, the coverage provided under this section is secondary.</p>

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
