### **Overview**

Modifies the youth skills training program and limits grants to \$100,000 each. Appropriates \$1,500,000 a year in ongoing funding from the workforce development fund for the youth skills training program.

# **Summary**

## Section Description

#### 1 Duties.

Adds that the youth skills training programs the commissioner of labor and industry approves must also train student learners for careers in high-growth, high-demand occupations.

#### 2 **Grant awards.**

Limits grant awards to local partnerships for youth skills training programs that train student learners for careers in high-growth, high-demand occupations to \$100,000 per grant.

#### 3 Appropriation; youth skills training program.

Appropriates \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2021 from the workforce development fund for the youth skills training program.

When the youth skills training program was created in the 2017 Jobs Omnibus law, it was also appropriated \$200,000 in fiscal year 2018 to develop training competencies for the new program and \$500,000 in fiscal year 2019 for grants and administration of the grant program.
