Overview

Certified birth and death records are issued by the state registrar at the Department of Health and by local issuance offices. This bill modifies the list of persons who may obtain an individual's certified birth or death record.

Summary

Section Description

1 Certified birth or death record.

Amends § 144.225, subd. 7. Makes the following changes related to who may obtain an individual's certified birth or death record:

- removes a requirement that an individual requesting a certified record has a tangible interest in the record and defining tangible interest, and instead lists individuals who may obtain a certified record;
- removes from the list of individuals who may obtain a certified record, the
 party responsible for filing the record (persons responsible for filing vital
 records include hospitals and other facilities where births occur; a physician,
 family member, or other person present at a birth for births outside a facility;
 and persons in charge of disposition of dead human bodies. With this change,
 these individuals will no longer be able to obtain certified birth or death
 records unless eligible under another provision in this subdivision); and
- provides that for an attorney to obtain a certified record, the attorney must represent the subject of the record or another individual listed in clause (1).
