## **Overview**

This bill provides a "hunger-free campus designation" for Minnesota State community and technical colleges.

1	Hunger free campus designation
	<b>Subd. 1. Establishment.</b> Provides for a "hunger free campus" designation for Minnesota State community and technical colleges meeting certain requirements.
	<b>Subd. 2. Designation approval.</b> Provides that the statewide student association representing the community and technical colleges will create the application process and approve the 3-year designations.
2	Appropriation for hunger free campus grants.
	Appropriates \$77,000 per year in ongoing funds to the Office of Higher Education for grants to campuses to meet the requirements for a hunger free campus designation under section 1 of the bill. The statewide student association representing the community and technical colleges will supervise distribution of the grants.
	A maximum grant award is \$8,000 and campuses must provide matching funds to receive the grant. Unencumbered amounts appropriated for this purpose may—with legislative approval—be transferred to fund emergency assistance for postsecondary students grants.
