## **Overview**

This bill creates a task force to make recommendations for expanding the right to court-appointed counsel to all eligible parents, guardians, and custodians in all child protection proceedings where a child is at risk of imminent removal from the child's home, or has been removed.

## **1** Parent Representation in Child Protection Proceedings Task Force.

**Subd. 1. Creation and duties.** Creates the task force, to make recommendations on expanding the right to court-appointed counsel for all eligible parents, guardians, and custodians in all child protection proceedings where risk of removal is imminent. Requires the task force to make recommendations on: (1) program administration; (2) recruitment and retention of attorneys; (3) estimated costs; and (4) the division of funding between the state and counties.

**Subd. 2. Membership.** Specifies requirements for the task force members, to be appointed by July 15, 2020. Specifies that members will not be compensated or reimbursed.

**Subd. 3. Officers; meetings; staff.** Requires the commissioner of human services to convene the task force by August 15, 2020, and to provide staff assistance. Requires the task force to elect co-chairs from among its members; specifies that the task force is subject to the Open Meeting Law.

**Subd. 4. Report required.** Requires a report to the legislature by February 1, 2021.

**Subd. 5. Expiration.** Specifies that the task force expires upon the submission of the report.

Makes this section effective the day following final enactment.
