Overview

H.F. 3246 would modify the definition of a microdistillery to include distillers producing 100,000 proof gallons of spirits per year or less and would allow expanded off-sale of spirits by a microdistillery, but only for those microdistilleries at or below the current 40,000 proof production limit.

Summary

Section Description

1 Microdistillery.

Increases the production limit to qualify as a microdistillery from 40,000 proof gallons annually to 100,000.

2 Off-sale license.

Limits off-sale of spirits by microdistilleries to only those distilleries producing 40,000 or fewer proof gallons of spirits per year, but allows off-sale of spirits in amounts up to 4.5 liters per customer per day. The current limit is 375 milliliters per customer per day.
