Subject State Register; Capitol activities report

Summary

This bill updates the law governing publication of the State Register. Among the changes are updates to outdated terminology, a reduction in the number of physical copies provided to the Legislative Reference Library and the State Law Library, and elimination of a requirement that a copy of the State Register be provided to a public library in every county seat in the state.

The State Register is the official publication of state government and includes various official notices and informational bulletins submitted for publication by state agencies. Among the types of notices that appear in the Register are notices related to the administrative rulemaking process, requests for proposals for construction projects and other professional services, state grant opportunities, and other miscellaneous orders and notices. The State Register is published weekly and is available online at: https://www.revisor.mn.gov/state_register/

This bill also modifies the due date of a report from the commissioner of administration on events held in the Capitol building. Current law provides an August 1 due date; this bill instead requires the report on September 15 of each year, and adds a condition that only those events for which the commissioner collected event fees are required to be reported.
