Under current law, it is a crime to access a computer, computer system, or computer network to obtain services or property if the person does not have authorization or claim of right to do so. It is also a crime to deprive the owner of the use or possession of a computer, software, or data.

1 Data.

Creates a definition of "data" in the list of definitions as used in computer crime statutes.

2 Acts.

Establishes a crime if someone intentionally, and without authorization, copies any computer software or data and uses, alters, transfers, retains, or publishes that software or data. Further makes it a crime to intentionally retain copies of any computer software or data beyond the individual's authority.
