| 1 | <p>Public safety peer counseling and debriefing.</p> <p>Extends the prohibition on the use of improperly disclosed public safety peer counseling information or opinions from just “personnel and occupational licensing matter[s]” to all “criminal, administrative, and civil proceedings” involving the subject of the counseling or debriefing.</p> |
| 2 | <p>Use of force reporting.</p> <p>Requires chief law enforcement officers to report to the superintendent of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension each incident of peace officer use of force that results in serious bodily harm or death. The superintendent must report the data collected to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as required under federal law. The superintendent must also annually report aggregate use of force data collected under this section to the legislature.</p> |
