Summary

This bill requires one of the five members of the Board of Animal Health (BAH) to be a member of a federally recognized tribe located in Minnesota.

Board members serve four-year terms and oversee the work of the BAH, which is a state agency of the same name that is charged by law with protecting the health of Minnesota livestock and other domestic animals. Board members are appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Minnesota Senate.
