

Bill Summary H.F. 1278 As introduced

- Subject Establishing a task force for early care and education
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Overview

This bill creates a task force that is required to develop a plan and an implementation timeline for ensuring that all families in Minnesota have access to high-quality, affordable early care and education for children from birth up to age five. The plan must provide that; (1) no family pays more than seven percent of its income for early care and education; (2) a child's access to high-quality early care and education is not determined by the child's race, income, or zip code; and (3) the early care and education workforce receives at least a livable wage and has access to professional development opportunities.

Summary

Section Description

1 Affordable, high-quality early care and education for all families.

Subd. 1. Goal. Provides that it is a goal of the state for all families to have access to high-quality, affordable early care and education for children from birth up to age five.

Subd. 2. Great Start for All Minnesota Children Task Force; establishment. Establishes the Great Start for All Minnesota Children Task Force to develop strategies to meet the goal defined in subdivision 1.

Subd. 3. Membership. Identifies the 19 voting members of the task force and the non-voting representatives from state agencies.

Subd. 4. Administration. Describes how the task force will be administered and provides that the task force expires when it submits its final report required under subdivision 9.

Subd. 5. Plan development. Requires that the task force develop a plan to achieve the goal outlined in subdivision 1 by 2031. The plan must create a system under which: (1) no family pays more than seven percent of its income for early care and education; (2) a child's access to early care and education is not

determined by the child's race, income, or zip code; and (3) the early care and education workforce is paid at least a livable wage and has access to professional development opportunities.

Subd. 6. Affordable, high-quality early care and education. Describes several strategies related to providing affordable, high-quality early care and education that the task force must incorporate into the plan developed under subdivision 5.

Subd. 7. Workforce compensation. Describes several strategies related to providing livable wages to the early care and education workforce that the task force must incorporate into the plan developed under subdivision 5.

Subd. 8. Implementation timeline. Directs the task force to develop an implementation timeline that phases in the plan developed under subdivision 5 over a period of no more than six years, beginning in July 2025 and ending no later than July 2031.

Subd. 9. Required reports. Requires that the task force submit to the governor and the legislature an interim report by July 1, 2022, and a final report by February 1, 2023.

2 Appropriation; Great Start for All Minnesota Children Task Force.

Provides blank appropriations for fiscal years 2022 and 2023 to the commissioner of management and budget for the task force.



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
