## **Overview**

Under current law, a petition for a harassment restraining order to protect a minor must be brought by the minor's parent, guardian, or conservator. This bill permits emancipated minors to petition for a harassment restraining order on their own behalf when it is in the best interests of the minor.

Section Description

## 1 Restraining order; court jurisdiction.

Permits an emancipated minor to seek a restraining order on that person's own behalf if the court determines that it is in the best interests of the child. Identifies the showing necessary to establish that the minor is emancipated. Makes the change in law effective the day following final enactment.
