

Bill Summary H.F. 3321 As Introduced

Summary

Makes a onetime appropriation of \$100,000 in fiscal year 2023 from the general fund for Minnesota Family Resiliency Partnership programs, to be distributed to existing programs. This appropriation is in addition to the \$225,000 from the workforce development fund that these programs will already receive in fiscal year 2023 under the 2021 omnibus law.

Minnesota Family Resiliency Partnership programs provide counseling and job training assistance to displaced homemakers, who generally are people who have spent a number of years providing homemaking services while dependent on another person who is now no longer providing support because they have died, become disabled, or divorced.

Prior workforce development fund appropriations to these programs: the 2021 omnibus law appropriated \$225,000 each year; the 2019 omnibus law appropriated \$100,000 each year; and the 2017 omnibus law appropriated \$150,000 each year.
