



- Subject Medical practices; current standard charges, price comparison tool
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 - Date February 4, 2021

Overview

This bill requires hospitals, outpatient surgical centers, and medical practices that have revenue of more than \$50,000,000 per year and that derive a majority of their revenue from certain services, to make available to the public and to the commissioner of health a list of current standard charges for all items and services provided by the medical practice. This bill also permits the commissioner of health to use this data to establish a price comparison tool for use by the public.

Summary

Section Description

1 Medical practices; current standard charges; comparison tool.

Adds § 62J.826. Requires medical practices to make available to the public and to report to the commissioner of health, a list of current standard charges for all items and services provided by the medical practice, and permits the commissioner of health to use this information to establish a price comparison tool for use by the public.

Subd. 1. Definitions. Defines terms for this section: chargemaster, diagnostic laboratory testing, diagnostic radiology service, hospital, medical practice, outpatient surgical center.

Subd. 2. Requirement; current standard charges. Requires the following medical practices to make available to the public a list of current standard charges for all items and services provided by the medical practice: hospitals, outpatient surgical centers, and other medical practices that have revenue of more than \$50,000,000 per year and that derive a majority of their revenue from one or more of the listed services.

Section Description

Subd. 3. Required file format and data attributes. Paragraph (a) lists and defines the data attributes that a medical practice must post, and requires them to be posted in the listed order.

Paragraph (b) requires these data attributes to be posted in the form of a comma separated values file.

Paragraph (c) requires the data attributes listed in paragraph (a) to be reported to the commissioner of health in a form, manner, and frequency specified by the commissioner, and to be made available to the public in a form and manner specified by the commissioner.

Subd. 4. Price comparison tool. Requires the commissioner of health to use information submitted under subdivision 3 to develop and make available a price comparison tool for use by the public, and allows the commissioner to contract with a third party for the development and operation of this tool.

This section is effective January 1, 2022.



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
