Overview

Under current law, as interpreted by the state supreme court, a person commits drive-by shooting if the person is in or recently exited a motor vehicle and shoots at another motor vehicle or a building. The law increases the penalty if the vehicle or building is occupied, or if the shooter also fires at a person. This bill amends the law so that a person can commit drive-by shooting by firing at an unoccupied vehicle or building, an occupied vehicle or building, or a person. There is no change to the penalties.

Summary

Section Description

1 Felony; drive-by shooting.

Divides the three ways in which a person can commit drive-by shooting into separate clauses. Amends the sentencing provision to refer to the clauses.
