

- Subject Law enforcement oversight and training
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 - Date February 1, 2021

Overview

This bill requires local units of government to establish law enforcement citizen oversight councils. The bill also requires the POST Board to develop a model policy and learning objectives on procedural justice and community interactions.

Article 1: Law Enforcement Citizen Oversight Councils

This article requires the local units of government that oversee a law enforcement department to establish a citizen oversight council.

	Subd. 1. Definition. Defines law enforcement agency.

	Subd. 4. Operation of council; powers and duties. Establishes the powers and duties of citizen oversight councils. Empowers oversight councils to make recommendations on any facet of the law enforcement agency's

operations and review the performance of the chief law enforcement officer (CLEO).

Subd. 5. Investigations into police misconduct. Authorizes oversight councils to investigate peace officer misconduct and recommend appropriate discipline.

Subd. 6. Duties of chief law enforcement officer. Requires CLEOs to cooperate and be accountable to oversight councils.

Subd. 7. Duties of governing body. Requires the governing body to ensure that oversight councils have a voice in law enforcement oversight.

Subd. 8. Other applicable law. Declares that oversight councils must comply with data practice requirements in chapters 13 and the open meeting standards in 13D.

Subd. 9. Annual report. Requires oversight councils to issue annual reports.

4 Timing.

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Establishes deadlines for local units of government to establish oversight councils.

Compliance reviews.

Directs the state auditor to make certain that local units of government are complying with section 3.

Article 2: Policies, Training, Reporting, Appropriations

This article requires the POST Board to develop a model policy and learning objectives on procedural justice and appropriates funds related to requirements established in this bill and peace officer safety.

Section Description – Article 2: Policies, Training, Reporting, Appropriations

1 Procedural justice; policies required.

Subd. 1. Model policy required. Directs the POST Board to develop a model policy on procedural justice that governs peace officer interactions with community members. Lists the topics that must be addressed in the model policy.

Section Description – Article 2: Policies, Training, Reporting, Appropriations

Subd. 2. Local policies required. Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt a procedural justice policy that complies with the model policy created pursuant to subdivision 1.

2 Procedural justice and community interaction skills; learning objectives.

Subd. 1. Preservice training learning objectives; requirements. Requires the POST Board to establish preservice training learning objectives on procedural justice. Peace officer candidates must satisfy the learning objectives before being licensed.

Subd. 2. In-service training learning objectives. Requires the POST Board to establish in-service training learning objectives on procedural justice. Requires peace officers to receive training in procedural justice.

Subd. 3. Learning objectives described. Lists the topics that preservice and inservice procedural justice learning objectives for procedural justice must cover.

3 Guidelines on positive community interactions.

Directs the commissioner of public safety to establish guidelines to encourage law enforcement agencies to implement changes in how peace officers may interact positively with community members.

4 **Appropriations.**

Appropriates funds: (1) to increase soft body armor reimbursements to peace officers; (2) for grants to law enforcement agencies to counsel officers; (3) for grants to local units of government to establish and maintain citizen oversight councils; and (4) to the POST Board to meet the requirements of this act.



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
