## **Overview**

This bill establishes minimum requirements for firearm owners to store their firearms and ammunition and establishes criminal penalties for violating the storage requirements.

# **Section Description**

#### 1 Ineligible persons.

Imposes a three-year firearms prohibition as a collateral consequence of committing a gross misdemeanor violation of section 2.

## 2 Firearm storage and ammunition storage requirements.

**Subd. 1. Storage.** Establishes minimum requirements for the safe storage of a firearm—a firearm must be stored unloaded with a locking device and separate from the firearm's ammunition. Creates an exception to the law for peace officers and permit-holders who store a loaded, holstered handgun in a quick access safe.

**Subd. 2. Transfer.** Requires that a locking device be included with a transferred firearm unless the transferee provides proof of ownership of a locking device that meets the requirements of this section.

**Subd. 3. Penalty.** Establishes penalties for violations of subdivisions 1 and 2. Penalties for violations of subdivision 1 range from a misdemeanor to a five-year felony based on the level of risk and harm caused by the violation. The penalty for a violation of subdivision 2 is a misdemeanor.

**Subd. 4. Limitations.** Prohibits charges for violating subdivision 1 if the firearm was accessed by someone who entered the structure where the firearm was stored without authorization.

## **Section Description**

**Subd. 5. Definitions.** Defines "authorized user," "child," "firearm," "loaded," "locking device," "peace officer," and "quick access safe" for purposes of this section.

#### 3 **Revisor instruction.**

Directs the revisor to update cross-references to reflect the creation of the new offenses in section 2 and the repeal of section 609.666 in section 4.

## 4 Repealer.

Repeals section 609.666, the current law governing storage of firearms.
