

Subject Income limits for housing support

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Overview

The commissioner of human services uses countable income, as defined by law, to determine both the eligibility for housing support under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 256I, and the benefit amount for housing support recipients.

This bill would reduce the amount of certain unearned income that would be considered countable income for the purposes of determining eligibility and benefit amounts for housing support.

Section	Description
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| 1 | <p>Countable income.</p> <p>Amends § 256I.03, subd. 7, to reduce the amount of countable income for SSI recipients living in certain supportive housing settings from 100 percent of the SSI benefit limit (less the medical assistance personal needs allowance) to 30 percent of SSI benefits received. Also sets countable income for SSI recipients who do not live in certain supportive housing settings at the SSI limit in effect at the time the recipient is receiving housing support, less the personal needs allowance. Sets countable income for recipients of unearned income other than SSI who live in certain supportive housing settings at 30% of total income after applicable exclusions and disregards. Specifies the MA personal needs allowance does not apply to unearned income recipients who live in the specified supportive housing settings. Specifies Tribal per capita payments are not considered countable income for purposes of the housing support program.</p> |
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Provides an August 1, 2023, effective date.



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
