Overview

This bill authorizes the governor to declare a peacetime emergency in response to a cyber attack, and adds references to physical or electronic attacks on the state's information and telecommunications technology infrastructure, systems, or services in a number of areas of the state's emergency management law.

Defines the term "information and telecommunications technology systems and services." The definition conforms to the term as defined in the statutes that govern the operation of MNIT. |

Defines the term "cyber attack." This term is used later in the bill. |
| 4 | Declaration of peacetime emergency.
Authorizes the governor to declare a peacetime emergency, with all existing associated powers and duties provided in law, in response to a cyber attack.

This section also reorganizes existing language related to the declaration of a peacetime emergency. |
| 5 | Governor's powers to provide fast emergency aid.
Adds references to the safety of the state's information and telecommunications technology infrastructure, systems, or services in the existing law authorizing the |

	governor to enter contracts or incur other obligations necessary to respond to an emergency.
6	Repealer. Repeals a definition of “local government.” This term is recodified with a new subdivision number earlier in the bill.
