## **Overview**

This bill authorizes individuals who are age 16 or 17, and who would otherwise be eligible to vote except for age, to submit a voter registration application and be preregistered to vote.

# Summary

# **Section Description**

#### 1 Registration.

Permits an individual who is under the age of 18, but is at least 16 years of age, to preregister to vote by submitting a voter registration application.

## 2 **Prohibitions**; penalty.

Provides a cross-reference in a section of law outlining certain voter registration crimes, to reflect the new allowance in this bill for 16- and 17-year old individuals to preregister to vote.

## 3 Preregistration.

Details the specific registration procedures for individuals who are under the age of 18, but who are at least 16 years of age, to preregister to vote.

#### 4 Form.

Updates the voter registration application form to reflect the ability of otherwise eligible individuals to preregister to vote beginning at age 16.

#### 5 Public information lists.

Prohibits the public disclosure of data on applicants who have preregistered to vote until the voter is fully registered (upon reaching the age of 18) or has voting history.

## 6 Transition to new voter registration application forms.

Authorizes a transition period during which elections officials may use existing stocks of voter registration applications, provided that the applications may not be further printed or copied until the application has been updated to comply with the requirements of this bill.
