

Subject Term Limits; State Constitutional Amendment

Overview

This bill proposes a state constitutional amendment establishing a limit of two terms on the office of governor and, separately, on the office of lieutenant governor. The proposed constitutional amendment would appear on the ballot at the 2026 state general election. If ratified by the voters, the term limits would be calculated beginning with the 2030 state general election.

Summary

Section	Description
1	Constitutional amendment proposed. Proposes a state constitutional amendment that prohibits a person from being elected more than twice to the office of governor. Similarly, a person is prohibited from being elected more than twice to the office of lieutenant governor.
2	Submission to voters. Specifies the wording of the question to voters that must appear on the ballot, along with the question's title. The proposed constitutional amendment would take effect in 2030, but the question would appear on the ballot at the 2026 state general election.
3	Applicability. Provides that elections prior to the 2030 amendment do not count in calculating the term limits established by the constitutional amendment.
