## Summary

Every two years, the chair of the Legislative Coordinating Commission rotates between the speaker of the House of Representatives and the president of the Senate. This bill specifies that when not serving as chair, the House speaker or Senate president serves as the Commission's vice-chair.

The legislature established the Legislative Coordinating Commission in 1973 to coordinate the legislative activities of the House of Representatives and Senate and the joint legislative commissions, committees, offices, and task forces.
