

Subject Driver and vehicle services fees

Overview

This bill modifies requirements on fees imposed as part of driver's license and motor vehicle transactions (such as application or renewal of a driver's license, motor vehicle registration, and title transfers). Among its provisions, the bill:

- reallocates filing fee revenue collected by Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) from mailed and online transactions, to direct a portion to deputy registrars and driver's license agents;
- establishes a \$5 surcharge on vehicle transactions handled by mail; and
- creates an account and a statutory appropriation for fee revenue distribution to full-service providers (who are entities appointed as both a deputy registrar and a driver's license agent).

Paragraph (g) reallocates filing fee revenue for mailed or online motor vehicle transactions, which includes directing a portion of the funds to a new account being established in the bill for distribution to full-service providers.

Paragraph (h) creates a new \$5 surcharge on mailed motor vehicle transactions and allocates the funds between DVS and full-service providers.

Reallocates filing fee revenue for mailed or online driver's license and Minnesota identification card transactions, which includes directing half of the funds to a new account being established in the bill for distribution to full-service providers.

3	<p data-bbox="316 262 706 294">Full-service provider account.</p> <p data-bbox="316 304 1429 457">Establishes a full-service provider account that holds some revenue from driver and vehicle transactions. Makes a statutory appropriation from the account for distribution to full-service providers, which is proportional based on transaction counts.</p>
