

Subject Requiring disclosure of investigations into possible overpayments

Overview

Section 13.46 in the Data Practices Act establishes when certain welfare data can be disclosed or must be maintained as nonpublic. In most cases, data related to an ongoing investigation is not public. Under current law, the commissioners of human services and children, youth, and families may disclose that an investigation into possible overpayment of public funds exists if the commissioner determines that disclosure will not compromise the investigation.

The bill requires the commissioners of human services and children, youth, and families to disclose the existence of an investigation into possible overpayment of public funds within 30 days of a request.
