

Subject Legislative security

Summary

This bill would create a Legislative Commission on Legislative Security to study the security needs of state legislators and staff while in a legislative district and to review legislation that impacts security for elected officials and staff.

The commission would have 14 members, seven from the senate and seven from the house of representatives. Of the appointed members, no more than five would represent the majority caucus in each house. The chair of the commission would alternate every two years between the house and senate. The commission could employ professional and technical staff as necessary to perform its duties.
