

Subject Collector vehicle use

Overview

This bill allows weekend operation of various collector vehicles during daylight hours on Saturdays and Sundays and explicitly allows their use related to car shows, exhibitions, parades, and similar special events. It also makes a variety of technical and clarifying changes, which include creating a centralized provision on the scope of collector vehicle operation. Effective the day after enactment.

Background. Current law establishes several types of vehicle registration categories in a collector class, namely: pioneer, classic car, collector, street rod, collector military, and classic motorcycle. Vehicles registered under the collector class are limited to only being operated as collector's items and not for general transportation, and the requirements for most types of collector's vehicles are silent on operation at shows, parades, and the like.

1	Collector's vehicle, pioneer plate. Broadens allowed operation of a vehicle registered with pioneer plates, by reference to a new provision. Makes technical changes.
2	Collector's vehicle, classic car plate. Broadens allowed operation of a vehicle registered with classic car plates, by reference to a new provision. Makes technical changes.
3	Collector's vehicle, collector plate. Broadens allowed operation of a vehicle registered with collector plates, by reference to a new provision. Makes technical changes.

Section	Description
4	Collector's vehicle, street rod plate. Broadens allowed operation of a vehicle registered with street rod plates, by reference to a new provision. Makes technical changes.
5	Collector military vehicle. Broadens allowed operation of a vehicle registered with collector military vehicle plates, by reference to a new provision. Makes technical changes.
6	Vehicle operation. Establishes a centralized provision on allowed operation of vehicles registered in the collector class. Retains a limitation on vehicle operation for general transportation. Allows for operation at club events, exhibitions, parades, and similar special events as well as during daylight on Saturdays and Sundays.
7	Definition. Modifies the definition of "classic motorcycle" in the state statute on classic motorcycle registration, to eliminate vehicle operation requirements that are being centralized and revised elsewhere in the bill.
8	Affidavit for registration and taxation. Broadens allowed operation of a vehicle registered with classic motorcycle plates, by reference to a new provision. Makes technical changes.
