

Subject Dissolution notices and updates on child protection study

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Overview

Changes the requirements for notice in dissolution cases and extends the funding and requirements for the Supreme Court Council on Child Protection and Maltreatment Prevention.

Summary

Section	Description
1	Notice to public authority. Updates the requirements for a petitioner in a family law case to notify the local unit of government, acting on behalf of the state, that is responsible for child support enforcement so that the petitioner only has to notify them of the filing when there is a child in the divorce proceeding.
2	Reports. Moves the due date up one month, from January 15, 2027, to December 15, 2026, for a study by the Supreme Court Council on Child Protection and Maltreatment Prevention that looks for improvements to the child protection system.
3	Expiration. Provides that the Supreme Court Council on Child Protection and Maltreatment Prevention continues to exist through the end of the fiscal year until June 30, 2027.
4	Supreme Court. Extends the funding for the Supreme Court Council on Child Protection and Maltreatment Prevention for one full year from the end of fiscal year 2026 to the end of fiscal year 2027, on June 30, 2027.



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
