

Subject Office of the Foster Youth Ombudsperson powers

Overview

This bill modifies the powers of the Office of the Foster Youth Ombudsperson by expanding individuals who may be investigated, allowing the ombudsperson to enter and inspect without notice any place where a foster youth is residing, specifying that the ombudsperson or staff may conduct private meetings or calls with foster youth, removing the requirement to inform certain individuals and entities of actions taken on a complaint, allowing the ombudsperson direct access to the social services information system, and expanding the ombudsperson's access to data.

Section	Description
1	Access to data. Amends § 13.876, subd. 3. Updates cross-reference to new subdivision.
2	Definitions. Amends § 260C.82, subd. 1. Adds the following definitions for purposes of the section governing the powers of the Office of the Foster Youth Ombudsperson: "agency," "placement," and "placement manager."
3	Powers. Amends § 260C.82, subd. 2. Modifies terminology, adds individuals whose actions may be investigated by the ombudsperson. Adds power to enter and inspect any place where a foster youth is residing, without notice; specifies that the ombudsperson has direct access to information and to the social services information system.
4	Complaints. Amends § 260.82, subd. 4. Adds "violation of rights" to complaints for the ombudsperson. Modifies terminology and clarifies complaint procedures.

Section	Description
	Removes the requirement for the ombudsperson to inform the complainant, the agency, or the subject of an investigation of the actions taken.
	Allows the ombudsperson or staff to conduct private meetings or calls with a foster youth.
5	Recommendations. Amends § 260C.82, subd. 5. Adds guardians ad litem to the individuals to whom the ombudsperson may make recommendations.
6	Data. Amends § 260C.82, subd. 7. Expands the data the ombudsperson has access to when access is necessary for the ombudsperson to perform statutory duties. Requires a placement to provide any data or information to the ombudsperson that the placement would be required to provide to its licensing agency.
