

Subject Dual enrollment
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Overview

Dual enrollment programs allow high school students to earn college credit while in high school. One type of dual enrollment program is called Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO). Students in PSEO earn high school and college credit through enrollment in a college-level course taught at a postsecondary institution (PSI) by college faculty. The course may be offered in person or online. Students choose the courses they want to enroll in and can enroll in PSEO on a part-time or full-time basis.

Students enrolled in 11th and 12th grade in a school district, charter school, nonpublic school, home school, or American Indian-controlled Tribal contract or grant school may participate in PSEO. Students must meet residency requirements.

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| 1 | <p>Authorization; student eligibility.</p> <p>Requires a postsecondary institution (PSI) to establish criteria for students applying to enroll in a PSEO course. The criteria must include: a minimum qualifying grade point average, performance on a standardized assessment, and class rank. The PSI may allow a student who doesn't meet the criteria to enroll in a PSEO course if the student's enrolling district, charter school, or Tribal contract school submits a letter recommending the student be allowed to enroll.</p> |
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
