Overview

This bill restricts the ability of undocumented noncitizens to access state benefits. Section 1 is a general prohibition. Sections 2 and 3 affect specific programs.

Summary

Section Description

1 State-funded services to undocumented noncitizens prohibited.

Generally prohibits undocumented noncitizens from receiving various services, grants, etc. that are funded by state tax revenue.

2 North Star Promise (NSP) scholarship program: definitions.

Amends NSP's definition of "eligible student" so that students who qualify as Minnesota residents under section 135A.043 (commonly referred to as the "Minnesota Dream Act") are not eligible for a scholarship award beginning in the fall 2025 academic term. The Minnesota Dream Act, which was passed in 2013, provided certain undocumented noncitizens in Minnesota the ability to access state financial aid.

3 MinnesotaCare: citizenship requirements.

Provides that undocumented noncitizens are not eligible for MinnesotaCare, effective immediately. MinnesotaCare provides subsidized health care coverage to low-income individuals in the state. Undocumented noncitizens first became eligible for the program on January 1, 2025.
