Overview

This bill modifies requirements an individual licensed to practice mortuary science in another jurisdiction must meet to obtain a reciprocal license to practice mortuary science in Minnesota.

Amends § 149A.30, subd. 1. Modifies requirements an individual licensed to practice mortuary science in another jurisdiction must meet to obtain a reciprocal license to practice mortuary science in Minnesota. Strikes language authorizing the commissioner to issue a reciprocal license if the credentialing requirements in the other jurisdiction are similar to the licensing requirements in Minnesota. Instead, requires an individual to obtain a passing score on a national board examination or another similar examination and requires the individual to submit documentation of:

- a passing score on the national board examination or similar examination;
- meeting certain education requirements;
- being credentialed in another jurisdiction and having practiced mortuary science in that jurisdiction for at least three years;
- not being subject to any pending investigations and not practicing under a restricted credential;
- having performed at least 25 funeral services, completed at least 25 funeral arrangements, and performed at least 25 embalming cases; and
- having completed the continuing education hours required in Minnesota law within the two years before applying for licensure.
