Title IV-A of the Social Security Act: authorizes the federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant program of assistance to states.

Title IV-B of the Social Security Act: provides funding and standards for establishing, extending, and strengthening child welfare services.

Title IV-D of the Social Security Act: authorizes measures to (1) enforce child support obligations by absent parents, (2) locate absent parents, (3) establish paternity, and (4) obtain child support.

Title IV-E of the Social Security Act: authorizes a state-federal program of foster care payments and adoption assistance payments.

Title XVI of the Social Security Act: authorizes the federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program for the aged, blind, and persons with disabilities.

Title XVII of the Social Security Act: authorizes the federal medical insurance program for the aged and persons with disabilities that is known as Medicare.

Title XIX of the Social Security Act: authorizes the joint federal-state MA program. MA is also known as Medicaid.

Title XX of the Social Security Act: authorizes the federal Social Services Block Grant program of assistance to states to help fund social services.

Title XXI of the Social Security Act: authorizes the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).

TPLPC: Transfer of Permanent Legal and Physical Custody (to a relative)

TPR: Termination of Parental Rights

USCIS: U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (federal)

USDA: U.S. Department of Agriculture (federal)
